

Youth Values Assessment Supplement

What is it?

- A free, online assessment for youth
- 30-minutes average completion time
- 42 items cover knowledge and behavior in values related to one's self, spirituality, community, friends, and the future
- Core set of values built by youth
- Cross-culturally reviewed
- Confidential score reports available immediately

Who should use it, and when?

- Youth, anytime, to self-assess knowledge and behavior related to their values
- Agencies, anytime, to assess youth values in a variety of areas

Why should this assessment be used?

- Youth may lack connections to their community and friends, have a poor sense of the future, and have little sense of their own principles
- Heightened self-awareness may lead to work on values and greater long-term success
- To promote conversation between youth and caregivers who can offer information and support for learning
- To establish immediate and short term learning goals using companion best practices curricula

Should this tool be administered alone, or with something else?

- Can be administered alone
- Can be administered in conjunction with other independent living assessment and training tools available at www.caseylifeskills.org
- Co-administration of the Youth Values assessment and the general Ansell-Casey Life Skills Assessment (ACLSA) provides a more thorough picture of a person's specific (values-related) and overall life skills preparation
